For dessert, guests were served Caramelle, a sweet dough filled with nutella, mascarpone cheese and berries and drizzled with chocolate.

Highlights of the evening included owner Filippo Frattaroli's rousing speech and his impressive show of brain teaser games that he stumped a few young attendees with at the end of the evening. The collection of past publications was on display and contributors were photographed with the edition that they were featured in.
